

Early Intervention Birmingham

Early Intervention (EI) is a new integrated health and social care partnership in Birmingham. It is providing a seamless pathway of care for the citizens of the city, helping to enhance the quality of life for its 1.3 million+ population. EI operates in five localities across Birmingham; north, south, east, west and central.

EARLY INTERVENTION GOALS

PREVENT

unnecessary hospital admissions and premature admissions to long-term residential care

AVOID

delays in discharge from hospital

SUPPORT

people to remain as independent as possible in their own home

EARLY INTERVENTION COMMUNITY TEAM (EICT)

EICT is an integrated multi professional health and care team that supports people to achieve their optimum level of independence after early supported discharge into their own home. EICT also prevents unnecessary hospital admissions and support people to remain and be looked after in their own home

HoBs (SPECIALIST PALLIATIVE CARE & END OF LIFE)

A collaboration of the four Birmingham and Solihull Hospices to support healthcare professionals with specialist palliative care advice & guidance and where appropriate to enable rapid Hospice Admission or Hospice at Home provision

EARLY INTERVENTION BEDS

Intermediate bed-based care within a community setting which supports patients to recover to the point where they can return to their own surroundings, ideally home to continue their recovery

iHUB

The integrated hub (iHub) is a single point of access for discharge to assess. Supporting discharges from acute hospitals and admissions and discharges in community settings. It can operate seven days a week 8am-8pm, depending on demand

MENTAL HEALTH

Mental health professionals working collaboratively across all EI pathways to help integrate mental and physical health care to enhance and improve outcomes for people

OLDER PERSON'S ASSESSMENT & LIAISON TEAM (OPAL)

Geriatrician led multi-disciplinary teams based at the front door of our acute hospitals. They help older people to avoid unnecessary hospital admissions and ensure they receive the right care they need to recover in the most appropriate setting, ideally in their own home
